8 classroom management tips

2. Establish, maintain, and restore relationships.

3. Use reminders and cues:

(Vocabulary: novelty = anything that is unusual. verbal = by speaking, visual= something you see.)

What cues to your teachers now use? In the past? Example/hint/suggestion:

4. Optimize classroom seating

(Vocabulary: Optimize = make something better).

How will you decide where student should sit? When/why might you have them change places?

Example/hint/suggestion:

5. Give behavior-specific praise.

Have you learned about praise in other classes? What? What are good things to say in English? In Japanese?

Example/hint/suggestion:

6. Set clear expectations.

(Vocabulary: *inclusive* = includes everyone, *focused*= has a clear goal, *considerate* = respects everyone.)

Example/hint/suggestion:

7. Actively supervise

What examples do you see in class now? In the past? Example/hint/suggestion:

8. Be consistent in applying rules

(Vocabulary: consistent = always the same, sagging jeans = jeans that are too low. You can see the person's underwear).

Example/hint/suggestion:
